## What is this resource about?

This chart is designed to provide a quick and easy reference point for busy teachers looking for web-based resources to support the use of ICT in RE. Whether it's for professional development or practical classroom ideas, significant starting points are highlighted, rooted in the curriculum requirements of both subjects.

ICT is a powerful tool which can serve RE well – this resource hopes to make working with it a little easier.
